## PROFILE

In addition, she prosecutes for the Health and Safety Executive, the General Medical Council, the Department for Business Enterprise and Regulatory Reform, the Department for Work and Pensions and has recently begun to act for Her Majesty's Revenue and Customs in Vat and Duties Tribunals.
